If you could send the IMS raw data with all fields right away, that would be greatly appreciated. If you redact fields, please indicate which ones were redacted and cite the statute under which the redaction took place. Please include a field reference table explaining what parameters were used for each field.

For the online reports you reference as unavailable, have the multiple regional (and other) offices send me the (raw) databases from which they compiled the information. These may take a bit longer for EEOC to collect, so I'd appreciate it if we could do the IMS data right away, and set a reasonable delivery date for the other reports as referenced in your publication. (Two months extension for the non-IMS portion seems reasonable to me) If these offices submitted information from their databases to OIT, please indicate what was submitted, when, and for what purpose. As with the IMS data, please have the offices submit a table explaining the contents and parameters of each field, and if any redactions took place, cite the code making these redactions necessary.

I appreciate your working on this request. Also, please send the remaining items from the request (i.e. elements and standards, roster and certification) along with the IMS data.

Thank you for giving me your time this morning to briefly explain how EEOC's data, found on our public website, is compiled for the annual reports on the Federal workforce. We cannot pull raw data directly from the online reports you reference, as the data was compiled by two or more offices within this agency.

As I explained our Office of Information Technology can pull raw data on federal hearings, to include appeals, for 2008 and 2009, referencing administrative judges. The data would be taken directly from our internal Integrated Mission System (IMS).
